B.L.A.Z.E. Mentoring Program Donates More Than 257 Hours to MNPS The time equates to a \$6,222 donation as calculated by MNPS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (May 13, 2019) – Breaking Limitations Accepting Zero Excuses (BLAZE) Mentoring Program dedicated more than 250 hours of volunteer mentoring during the 2018-2019 school year.

The mentoring program's goal is to make a positive impact on the lives of Metro Nashville Public School High School Students.

BLAZE volunteers aim to reduce any limits that students have relating to their future and to push students to be their best. BLAZE volunteers expose students to a variety of local career opportunities, guide students toward positive paths and build connections with students beyond the classroom.

BLAZE partnered with PENCIL and MNPS High School Academies to provide sessions in the core high schools.

PENCIL is an organization that links community resources to MNPS. The organization tracks the hours each PENCIL Partner donates and then calculates how much that volunteer time is worth in dollars and cents.

According to the latest calculation BLAZE mentors donated 257.75 hours during the 2018-2019 school year. According to PENCIL that is a monetary value of at least \$6,222.09

"As a department we are committed to being a positive force in our community, not just when we are resolving a crisis," Director Chief William Swann said. "Our mentoring program has made a lasting impact on a number of students and we look forward to another great school year when the students return after their summer break."

All of the NFD personnel who participate with the mentoring program do so on their off time.
